Managers Corner



It is Not better to ask forgiveness than seek permission.

Happy Spring, Ashland Conservancy,

As I write this issue's Manager Corner, temperatures are changing and getting warmer, which is excellent news that Spring is coming.

Spring cleaning will be in effect, and I want to remind you to check around the outside of your home while you declutter and clean the inside as well.

During the Springtime, the routine violations are trash and recycling cans not put away after service on Tuesday and Friday. Raccoons, foxes, mice, and vultures seek unsecured trash in cans and bags. Vultures are migratory birds protected by Federal law, and they cannot be tampered with. We need your help to keep Ashland clean and pest free. Do not leave bags outside of the can. Please remember that American Disposal uses a truck with a mechanical arm and does not usually pick up loose trash or boxes outside the cans.

Mildew, mud, and paint chipping are the second most violations during this time. Living in a forest comes with needing periodic maintenance to keep the front, back, and sides of your home clean. Take the time now to schedule cleaning of your siding and foundation. Most likely, foundations will need a fresh coat of paint for the bricks once you see it has been cleaned.

Lastly, your yard needs maintenance. For years Ashland prides itself on having lush green lawns and beautiful trees in the community. Every home requires having a tree in the front yard per the guidelines.

Yards should not have bare spots, weeds, overgrown or yellowing grass.

These violations are seen regularly, but the worst offenses are found when owners sell their homes. Unfortunately, many neighbors think they are doing the right thing but are not following the guidelines. Other times, they don't want to involve the Association with their property. Buying a home in Ashland Conservancy is more than property ownership; it is an agreement with 880 + members of the Association.

All owners should have the most recent Architectural Review and Covenants guidelines provided to them upon the purchase of their home. The last updated version was in 2015 and can be downloaded from our website.

Not following the guidelines can delay the sale of your home, require the current owner to make expensive repairs, or remove the modification entirely. It is Not better to ask forgiveness than to seek permission. Not only is it the right thing to do, but it shows you care about your neighbors and the community.

January 2022

Memorandum for Ashland Community

Subject: Minutes of the Board of Directors monthly meeting

The Ashland Board of Directors meeting was held at the Community Center on Monday, January 17, 2022. Call to order of meeting at 6:30 PM.

ATTENDEES:

Dave Costa - President, Frank Falgiano - Vice President, Board Directors Mark Solomon, Steve Matias and Melody Buba.

Three owners attended the meeting.

BUSINESS:

Approved minutes of the December 2021 Board of Directors Meeting by a vote of (5-0).

An owner addressed the Board regarding late fee. The Board discussed the account in executive session and owner notified results after meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

ARCC

Processing of ARCC applications proceeds as normal. Hearings were rescheduled for February due to weather.

Events

The Committee scheduled the Easter Egg Hunt for April 9, 2022.

Pool

The Committee provided the Board with an update on contract reviews. Four proposals have been submitted for the 2022 pool season.

Newsletter Committee

January and February newsletter completed late due to weather.

March and April newsletter submissions due by February 28, 2022.

Open Space Committee

The Chairman was unable to attend and will update Board at next meeting.

Communications Committee

Chairman Traci Coscio updated the Board. A survey will be sent out to owners via email and Facebook to find out how owners prefer to be contacted.

Welcome Committee

Chairman Traci Coscio updated the Board via email.

FINANCIALS:

Balance Sheet

Due to the enormity of compiling Year-End Financials for Sites, December's Financials were delayed. Management stated, accounting said Year-End Financials will be delivered during the last week in January.

Accounts Receivable

Management presented the Board with an update on Delinquent Accounts from accounts receivable and the recently hired collection agency. The Board requested additional clarification from the collection agency regarding the process.

Investment Accounts

Operating Account Statements from Capital One Bank and Investment Accounts from Morgan Stanley and The John Marshal Bank were presented to the Board.

<u>Clubhouse Revenue</u>

Management reported that income for renting the clubhouse, replacement FOBs, and pool passes earned \$8573 in 2021.

CONTRACTED SERVICES:

Community Center Cleaning:

Clean Advantage continues to provide services without issues.

Trash Removal:

Some services impacted by weather and COVID.

Management notified the Board that they have a negotiated price with American Disposal and a contract is pending.

General Maintenance and Construction:

- 1. The men's bathroom door and supply door were replaced by Ed Flores before painting started. Installation of new PVC partitions for urinals completed.
- 2. Pickleball courts are playable, and residents are happy. Management requires the vendor to paint additional green per contract to receive full payment.
- 3. LED lights installation completed in gym by KOLB electric. Ed Flores replaced light fixture under American Flag.
- 4. Hahn and Hahn scheduled to paint fitness center and bathrooms January 31 through February 8.
- 5. A-1 Glass deposit for half the invoice is due before work can begin. Management will inquire with AVID on issues for payment. The owner responsible will be billed for the repairs.
- 6. Stanley Security working on repairing computer for FOB systems. A power surge may have fried the stand-alone computer.
- 7. Management negotiating prices for Hahn and Hahn to sand and stain wood area at townhomes playground.
- 8. A leaking iron pipe was repaired by Cavalier Fire Protection.
- 9. Storage Shed completed.
- 10. Town home parking lot resurfacing still scheduled for Spring or Summer after landscaping from Architects completed.

<u>Grounds</u>

AL&L renovated landscaping at the clubhouse and payment completed.

AL&L warranty covers plants for six months and one replacement. They will use a water truck to maintain.

AL&L contracted to replace the irrigation system around the clubhouse. The installation has not started at this time.

Pocket Park electrical repair scheduled with Kolb electric. The irrigation will need plumbing under Assateague to be identified so AL&L can segregate the park from the monument area.

Management recommended keeping storm pond maintenance under AL&L and is negotiating cost.

Swimming Pool Management and Pool Issues

Please see note comments under Pool Committee.

Snow Removal

AL&L contracted for 2022. The agreement includes a provision to contact Management with two inches or less accumulation.

Basketball, Pickleball and Tennis Courts

Touch up work at Vendor's Expense is pending this spring. Final payment not made.

Fitness Center & Clubhouse:

Fit Repairs NoVa performed a quarterly inspection in November, and all machines are correctly working. Will inspect in February.

The new printer for the office is on backorder and Scheduled for May. Billing for phone and internet resolved and now saving \$200 a month.

Security / Monitoring System:

Off Duty Police Officers Continue to Patrol Ashland. The availability of officers varies, but PWC is performing duties as expected. They ask owners to call them if they witness crime or transportation issues such as parking violations. Stanley computer upgrades are pending.

<u>Playgrounds:</u>

Management secured all courts. Combinations are given to owners as requested.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES:

<u>Management</u>

FirstService Residential is an annual contract: Management is involved with various projects, negotiating, financials, supervision, delinquency control, revenue generation, and other tasks assigned by the Board of Directors.

Onsite Staff:

No issues.

Legal:

The Board approved transferring the Association's legal account to the Law Firm Bean, Kinney & Korman.

Master Insurance:

Ashland's Insurance continues to be in effect for Ashland and the Off-Duty Police Officers.

<u>Landscape Architectural Design</u>: The vendor's plans for the townhome area are pending.

Executive session: The Board went to Executive Session to discuss personnel, delinquency, and open forum requests.


Residents have inquired about the appropriate color to repaint the fading and chipping mailbox posts.

TRASH PICKUP - Household waste only, no construction or remodeling waste. No Household Hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas, antifreeze, corrosive chemicals, etc.). For more information on Household Hazardous Waste contact the Prince William County Office of Solid Waste @ 703-792-6254.

YARD DEBRIS - Grass clippings & leaves should be bagged in brown paper bags, these compostable paper bags can be purchased online, you can buy them at the grocery store, or find them at warehouse stores such as Home Depot, Lowes or any garden center. We will not collect yard debris material in plastic bags. Personal cans may be used, however they need to be clearly marked *Yard Debris* Tree limbs and brush must be no longer than 4-5 feet in length and 3 inches thick in diameter. These items must be tied with rope or twine in arm length bundles. Items that are bagged or bundled are not to exceed 50 lbs. Rocks, bricks, sod and dirt are not acceptable. We will collect up to 10 bags and/or labeled personal cans and up to 10 bundles of brush per collection.

Yard waste season ends effective December 24th, and will resume March 1st, 2022

RECYCLING PICKUP - Acceptable items include: Aluminum cans, aluminum foil & trays rinsed & cleaned, metal food & beverage cans, #1 thru #7 plastics, plastic bottles, wide mouth plastic containers & rigid plastics. Newspapers, mixed paper, junk mail, magazines, phone books & catalogs. Empty aerosol cans. Cardboard, paperboard (including cereal boxes without the lining and frozen food packages, etc) and corrugated cardboard. Moving boxes are recyclable & must be placed out with recycling collection. *These items may be commingled in the same recycling container. We prefer you do not use plastic bags for recycling.

BULK ITEMS - Please notify customer service @ 703-368-0500 at least 24 hours in advance when putting out bulk items.

HOLIDAYS – American Disposal Services does not operate on Thanksgiving, Christmas, or New Year's days. Your trash &/or recycling will be picked up on the next scheduled collection day.
