ASHLAND CONSERVANCY, INC. 2021 ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES/ NOTES MONDAY, OCTOBER 18, 2021.

The annual meeting was called to order by David Costa, Board of Directors, at 7:00 p.m.

Mr. Costa thanked everyone for attending. He welcomed Melody Buba as the newest Board Member. Brian English stepped down after moving out of Ashland.

In attendance Dave Costa, Frank Falgiano, Steve Matias, and Mark Solomon, and Melody Buba from Ashland's Board of Directors. Michael Constant, Portfolio Manager, FirstService Residential and Jeffry Gardunio, Ashland's General Manager, were in attendance.

It has been another trying year for everyone, COVID-19 presented new challenges and tough decisions for the Board and Homeowners alike. It also in some way affected most of our contracts, landscaping and trash removal feeling the most significant effect, while maintenance and new contracts for projects were also affected.

Management confirmed that there was no quorum.

Owners in attendance confirmed receiving a copy of the annual meeting notice.

There were no 2020 annual meeting minutes to approve because there was no quorum. Discussion items from the meeting were handed out to owners in attendance.

Mr. Costa provided updates on the association to members. A slide show of the 2020 board accomplishments and future planning was viewed by all in attendance.

There will be no elections for the board of directors since there is no quorum.

Mr. Costa reported on the annual budget and expenses. The increase in invest and cash assets are the highest ever for Ashland Conservancy at \$936,650. Delinquency level less than 5% Gross Revenue. The Board hired a Collection Agency to work on reducing delinquency.

0% Assessment Fee increase for 2022. Have not raised fees in four years. Inflation rate rose roughly 2% during these years.

The insurance premium remained low.

First Service Residential is the property management company.

Completed projects for 2021 improved landscaping and curb appeal to monuments and common areas. The Board replaced a 22-year-old wooden tot lot, repaired drainage issues at the tot lot and installed a sidewalk at the townhomes lot.

The Association completed pickleball court repairs and fenced in the basketball court at the Fincastle Park.

A storage shed was constructed behind and next to the swimming pool for the events committee and office storage.

Architectural designs of landscaping for clubhouse, monument entrances, and general areas were accepted.

Projects for 2022 include new plants and flowers at Carrs Brooke monument and clubhouse. Replace Fitness center lights with LED, paint fitness center and bathrooms, replace pool furniture, have engineer develop a plan for townhomes, upgrade irrigation systems at Carrs Brooke and front of Clubhouse.

The Events Committee started gatherings in May. The Committee is responsible for hosting Pizza at the Pool, Ice Cream Social, Fall Festival, Halloween and Christmas Decorating contest, and Cookies with Santa.

The Architectural Review and Covenants Committee has the duty to ensure homeowners modifications follow guidelines. They also recommend resolutions to violations. The Committee has four members and needs more volunteers.

The Communications, Welcome, and Open Space Committees were all started this year. The Pool Committee returned for the first time in years. All need more help and input from the neighborhood.

Mr. Costa stated nothing happens without volunteers.

The Board reported Saul Centers Inc. has been in negotiations with the PWC Planning Commission to develop the parcel of land on the corner of Spriggs Rd and RT234. They were proposing to build a Gas Station, Car Wash, and Tire Store (Automotive Complex).

During the meeting the PWC Fire Department updated the community that they have purchased ½ and acre of land from the County. They plan to build a new station in place of the Tire Store. They presented examples to all in attendance. They hope to have construction completed by 2025. They asked for feedback from owners in attendance.

Owners asked about traffic studies, impact on Forrest Park High School, the flow of traffic, and impact to homes directly across from the proposed station. The Fire Department said they are using all information available to ensure the neighborhood is safe.

Mr. Costa presented the 2021 annual budget during the PowerPoint presentation. The five-year plan was also presented.

Mr. Costa thanked the board for stepping up and doing the things they do. Members in attendance gave the board a round of applause.

The floor was opened for any questions or concerns. Homeowners raised concerns about the trees along Warm Springs that stop their yards from growing and endanger their homes due to the fact they have grown too tall. The Board let them know the guidelines gives them opportunities to modify their lot, which includes tree removal. They asked the owners to contact the General Manager.

Homeowners asked the Board to continue monitoring the Saul Center Developments and please share any new information. They asked for the Board to keep safety in mind for the traffic flow that the new Fire Station would bring.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

Managers Corner



Association Members, I hope this letter finds you and your family doing well and staying healthy. The Association experienced a lot of changes in 2022.

After 22 years, Alex Hubley is retiring from the fitness center coordinator position. Alex has helped thousands of residents acclimate to the community over the years. Whether it was processing recreational facility cards, producing the newsletter, or helping the on-site manager, Alex is a cornerstone to building the community. Her position has yet to be filled, so she is supporting the Association until a replacement is found.

Another cornerstone of the community is Nerene Rouse. She was the Chairman of the Events Committee for 15 years. She oversaw organizing and coordinating all the events, including the fall festival, easter egg hunt, pizza at the pool, and her favorite cookies with Santa. Nerene wanted everyone to be happy and always put her heart and soul into planning every event and having something people could look forward to. Kachia Wright is the new Chairman and has already worked hard at all the 2022 events. Thank you, Kachia, for stepping up, and Nerene, for serving the Association.

Finally, Michael Constant from Zalco and First Service Residential is no longer the Portfolio Manager of Ashland Conservancy HOA. Michael helped build the community for 25 years and helped many General Managers, including me, get acclimated to the culture of Association Management. He was the first manager who oversaw the developer handing over the community to the Association.

The Annual meeting had 65 attendants by proxy and in person; it was not enough for the quorum of 10%. However, the By Laws allow the President to close and reopen the meeting. If 5% or 44 attendants are recorded quorum is reached.

Supervisor Andrea Bailey gave an update about the community and county. A representative from the Saul Center spoke and gave updates on the new fire station planned for The Prince William Fire Department on the corner of Spriggs Road and Forrest Park Drive.

The Board accomplished significant projects in 2022, including milling and paving the parking lots at the townhomes, updating the fitness center with a new bike, new paint, LED lights, and other fixtures, building a shed for the events committee, and enhancing the entrance's landscaping and clubhouse.

An election was held for the first time in years due to meeting the 5% quorum. All of the current Board of Directors were voted in to continue serving. The Board will determine their positions and terms at November 21, 2022, meeting at the Community Center.

We currently have the ARCC, Events, Open Space, Communications, and Welcome Committee serving the community. Nothing happens in the Association without volunteers. We need your help.

TRASH PICKUP - Household waste only, no construction or remodeling waste. No Household Hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas, antifreeze, corrosive chemicals, etc.). For more information on Household Hazardous Waste contact the Prince William County Office of Solid Waste @ 703-792-6254.

YARD DEBRIS - Grass clippings & leaves should be bagged in brown paper bags, these compostable paper bags can be purchased online, you can buy them at the grocery store, or find them at warehouse stores such as Home Depot, Lowes or any garden center. We will not collect yard debris material in plastic bags. Personal cans may be used, however they need to be clearly marked *<u>Yard Debris</u>* Tree limbs and brush must be no longer than 4-5 feet in length and 3 inches thick in diameter. These items must be tied with rope or twine in arm length bundles. Items that are bagged or bundled are not to exceed 50 lbs. <u>Rocks, bricks, sod and dirt are not acceptable</u>. We will collect up to 10 bags and/or labeled personal cans and up to 10 bundles of brush per collection.

Yard waste season ends effective December 24th, and will resume March 1st, 2023

RECYCLING PICKUP - Acceptable items include: Aluminum cans, aluminum foil & trays rinsed & cleaned, metal food & beverage cans, #1 thru #7 plastics, plastic bottles, wide mouth plastic containers & rigid plastics. Newspapers, mixed paper, junk mail, magazines, phone books & catalogs. Empty aerosol cans. Cardboard, paperboard (including cereal boxes without the lining and frozen food packages, etc) and corrugated cardboard. Moving boxes are recyclable & must be placed out with recycling collection. *These items may be commingled in the same recycling container. We prefer you do not use plastic bags for recycling.

BULK ITEMS - Please notify customer service @ 703-368-0500 at least 24 hours in advance when putting out bulk items.

HOLIDAYS – American Disposal Services does not operate on Thanksgiving, Christmas, or New Year's days. Your trash &/or recycling will be picked up on the next scheduled collection day.

Please have your waste & recycling @ curbside by 5:00 AM or the night before.
